Shoreline Park was dedicated in 1990 and made possible by the generosity of the Frost-Parker Foundation in memory of Zella and John G. Frost.

Piers were in existence at Shoreline Park as early as 1846. Later, three long piers were built by the Baltimore and Ohio Railway for commercial use. Iron ore, grain, lumber, sand, crushed stone and packaged freight were shipped from Shoreline Park. Ferry boats and barges wintered at these piers which were last used in 1973.



Shoreline Park is a great location to watch the lake freighters enter Sandusky Bay on their journey to the coal docks. A playground structure for youth of all ages is available for family enjoyment; it overlooks Sandusky Bay.

A covered shelter, with picnic tables to seat up to sixty people, is available to rent for private functions.



A new comfort station was constructed in 2006 thanks to the Sandusky Rotary Club's Centennial Project, city and school district staff, and numerous volunteers. It was dedicated in memory of Rotarian, W. Gary Romp.
